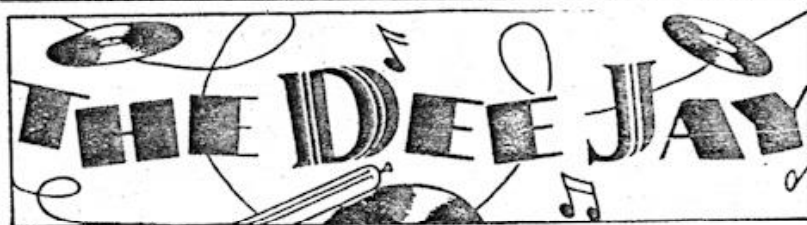
Lord in this town i've so much trouble
